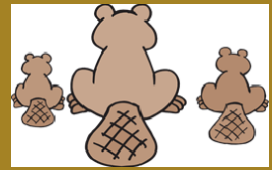

FREQUENT SHOPPER PROGRAM

The Community Economic Development Committee has organized a local Frequent Shopper Program which is designed to reward people who spend their money at local businesses. Frequent Shopper stamp cards are available at local participating businesses and the Town Office until October 8, 2021. Shoppers will get one stamp on their card for every \$15.00 spent or the equivalent amount as decided by the participating business. Fully stamped cards can be entered into a weekly draw, prizes for which will be donated by participating businesses. A Grand Prize draw is scheduled for Tuesday, October 12, 2021. All filled cards, including those drawn as weekly prize winners will be eligible for the Grand Prize Draw.



The Municipal Election is coming up on Monday, October 18th, 2021. Here is your chance to make a difference in your community. Stop by the Town office to pick up a nomination package or visit the website at beaverlodge.ca and go to Local Government and then Town Council. The 2021 Municipal Election Handbook will provide a brief overview of the governing structure and its roles

and responsibilities of the Town of Beaverlodge council and councilors, your requirements of being a candidate, and the process and procedure on election day.

Overview of Council: The Town of Beaverlodge Council consists of the Mayor and six (6) Councilors. Town Council is the main governing and legislative body for the town. Mayor and Councilors are required to attend the regular Council meetings and are also expected to sit on various committees, boards and external bodies. The term of office is four years. The Town does not run on a ward or district system; this means each member of Council represents the Town as a whole and not a particular neighborhood.
