

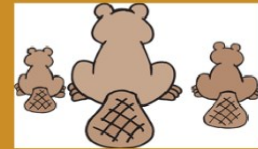

Beaverlodge Recreation Center – October Aquatic Program Details

Lane Swim

- 25 metre lap pool
- 5 lanes available
- Leisure pool and whirlpool and available at this time

Public Swim

- Use of all 3 pool basins available
- Anyone & everyone welcome to come for public swim.
- One lane is always available for use.
- Toys provided includes; a large inner tube placed in the main pool, pool nets, large flotation mats in animal shapes, noodles, PFD's and more

Other Important Information

- Pool schedule is subject to change.
- All programs are drop in - no registration is required.
- All skill levels are welcome to participate.
- Hot tub is available to gym users during scheduled public and lane swim times.
- Pool schedules, swim lesson schedules, membership information and event booking forms are available at the front desk.

Aquafit – Deep

- This class is done in the deep end of the pool, it is a great cardio workout using buoyancy belts.
- There is no impact on the joints, making it a perfect environment for those with injuries or limitations.

Aquafit – Shallow

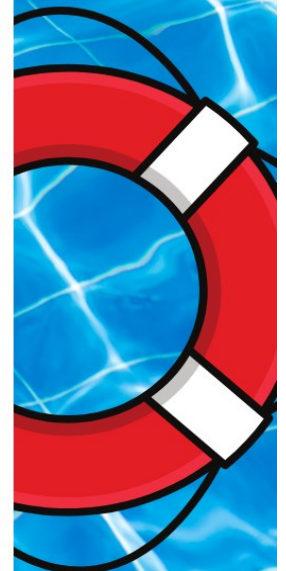
- Takes place in the shallow end of the main pool.
- Low impact workout that suits all fitness levels.
- You control the intensity, putting the level of difficulty in your hands.

Aquafit – Uninstructed

- Takes place in the deep end, shallow end & lazy river. Allowing you to move around to where you want. Stay in one area or split your time between all 3 pool basins.
- The class instructor is you. It allows you to use all the equipment we have available. You can do your own thing or follow the suggested workout provided on the boards around the pool.

Aquafit – Combo

- Explore the dimensions of the water by incorporating both the shallow & the deep end.
