

## ID Required to Vote – Photo ID & proof of physical address

Proof of identity and current residence is now required to be able to vote in municipal elections. Any of the following documents that has your name and physical address on it will be accepted as valid proof:

- Photo ID issued by the Canadian Government or agency, whether federal, provincial or local, i.e., Driver's License or Passport;
- Bank/credit card statement or personal cheque;
- Personal Income Tax Assessment or Property Tax Assessment;
- Utility bill: i.e., telephone, television, electricity or gas;
- Vehicle ownership document - registration or insurance certificate
- Insurance policy or coverage card;
- Correspondence issued by a school, college or university;
- Government cheque or cheque stub;
- Letter from a public curator, public guardian or public trustee;
- Pension Plan statement of benefits, contributions or participation;
- Residential lease or mortgage statement
- Statement of government benefits: i.e., employment insurance, old-age security, social assistance, disability support, or child tax benefit:
- A person may validate your identity and your address by accompanying you to the voting station and filling out the appropriate form.
