One senior member retired from the department after 16 years



Continuing to do the crack sealing, working out well so far.
Concrete work will Start week of July 10 <sup>th</sup> . Still working on asphalt
Have reviewed expectations on starting the plant early to ensure we have additional cooling time for the slab with staff and contractors. If all goes as planned we will be ready to operate by Aug 15 <sup>th</sup> 2023.
Tree removal and stump grinding will occur Starting June 16 <sup>th</sup> 2023, tree planting will occur in the fall per the arborist recommendation.
4 of the 7 valves/Hydrants that are scheduled to be looked at this year have been completed. We have repaired 2 hydrants that were Out of Service, and we have installed 2 Inserta valves that give us better ability to isolate smaller areas of town in the event of a water break.
