IMPORTANT NOTICE

REGARDING UTILITY BILLING

The last week of May, 2023 our radio communcations system that reads water meters failed. Since this date, we have not been able to get the reads which produce our billing for consumption.

We have only been able to bill for basic charges and NO CONSUMPTION at this point.

We have been working diligently contacting the service provider to obtain replacement end points in order to get the radio communications working again.

We encourage residents and business owners to take a photo of their water meter and send it with your physical address to **utilities@beaverlodge.ca** prior to September 28th, 2023 and the last business day of the month after that until the system is back working. We can then manually enter your readings to provide an acurate bill.

Once we have resolved the communications issue, we will be able to get the readings from the end of May to current, and proper billing will resume.

We continue to encorage residents and business owners to put money onto their accounts so they are not hit with a large consumption bill once the system is back up and running. We thank those that have already done this.

We understand the frustration this has caused and appreciate your patience as we work through this issue.
