The Beaverlodge Christmas
Hampers and Food Bank Society
(BCHFBS) was founded in 2009
through the collaborative outreach
of local churches in the Beaverlodge
area. From the beginning, It has
been driven by a simple but
powerful mission: to support
individuals and families facing food
insecurity by helping them meet
their most basic needs with dignity
and compassion

The organization was established as a registered society and is governed by a volunteer board of directors, including a Chair, Secretary, Treasurer, and members-at-large. Board members typically serve a minimum of three-year terms.

The vision of the group is to be a consistent and reliable resource for those experiencing hardship and to ensure that no one in Beaverlodge and surrounding areas goes without food or basic necessities, especially during critical times like the holidays.

The Beaverlodge Food Bank operates year-round to provide monthly food hampers to individuals and families in need. Clients may receive one hamper every 30 days, containing non-perishable staples and, when available, perishable and frozen items.

Each winter, the food bank teams up with the Beaverlodge Volunteer Fire Department and other local volunteer organizations for the annual Fire Truck Food Drive, a highly visible and well-supported initiative that collects non-perishable food items and raises awareness about hunger in the community.

During the holiday season, the organization distributes Christmas Hampers, which offer additional seasonal support to ensure families can enjoy a dignified holiday meal, and to spread a little extra joy to children and families.

In partnership with FCSS, the food bank is also involved in a Meals on Wheels program, delivering frozen meals twice a month to local seniors and those in need.

Additionally, the food bank collaborates with other local agencies and programs when extra assistance is needed, making it a valuable hub for wraparound support in times of crisis.

The food bank is volunteer-run and offers a variety of opportunities for community members to get involved.



A typical volunteer might:

- Collect, sort and stock donated food items, as well as shop for items in fill in the gaps
- · Assemble food hampers
- Help with hamper distribution on Monday mornings
- Assist with seasonal events like the Fire Truck Food Drive or Christmas Hamper prep and delivery
- Join the Board of Directors or help with admin/financial roles and society decisions.
- Participate in meal and hamper prep or delivery.

Volunteering is flexible and can be tailored to the individual's availability and interests. Whether you want to help regularly or just lend a hand during busy times like Christmas, there's a role for everyone.

To volunteer, no prior experience is required – just a willingness to help. Depending on the role, a Criminal Record Check may be requested, especially for anyone working directly with vulnerable populations. For most general food bank tasks like sorting, packing, or assisting at events, reliability, and a heart for service are the main requirements. 

Water Utility and Garbage/Recycle ByLaw Amendments

This notice is to inform you of recent amendments to our Water Utility and Garbage & Recycling Bylaws. These bylaws were passed at the April 28, 2025 Council meeting. The following changes will take effect **June 1, 2025:**

WATER UTILITY BYLAW 923L



All consumers connected to municipal sewer shall pay a monthly sewer distribution charge and this charge shall be based on water meter size:

a. 5/8" (15mm)	\$10.50
b. 3/4" (18mm)	\$11.25
c. 1" (25mm)	\$12.20
d. 1 1/2" (37.5mm)	\$35.50
e. 2" (50mm)	\$42.50
f. Greater than 2" (50mm)	\$64.00

All consumers connected to municipal sewer shall pay a consumption rated based on the meter reading of the supply of water to the consumer. The rate shall be \$2.20 per cubic metre (m³) of water used per month. (Previous rate was \$2.00 per cubic metre)

BULK WATER RATE



All purchasers of water from the truck fill station at the Water Plant shall pay \$10.75 per cubic metre (m³) (Previous rate was \$10.50)

GARBAGE & RECYCLING BYLAW 1014-1

All consumers with Town garbage bins shall pay the monthly garbage fee as follows:

a. 1 set of Black, Green, & Blue bins \$16.50

b. Each extra bin \$ 7.50 (Previous rates were \$15.00 and \$6.50)





Town of Beaverlodge Tax Notices Mailed

Property tax notices for 2025 were mailed on Thursday May 15, 2025 to approximately 1251 property owners in the Town of Beaverlodge. Along with their tax notices, property owners will receive details on:

- 2025 Property Assessment & Taxes Information brochure.
- Education property tax brochure.

Property tax payments are due by July 31, 2025. Payments made after this date will be subject to a penalty.

- In-person, from 9am-12 (noon) and 1pm-5pm Monday Friday, excepting statutory holidays.
