

September 22 Last Day to Submit Names For Council

With municipal elections set for October 20, 2025, the Town of Beaverlodge is encouraging residents to consider stepping forward as candidates. Nominations are officially open and will remain so until noon on September 22, 2025.

Becoming a municipal councillor is more than just winning an election—it's an opportunity to shape the future of the community. Councillors make decisions that affect infrastructure, budgeting, economic development, and the delivery of essential services. From local roads to recreation facilities, their influence can be seen in the everyday lives of residents.

What Councillors Do

Elected officials serve as the voice of the community, ensuring local needs and concerns are heard. Municipal councils are responsible for setting policies, passing bylaws, and approving budgets. They oversee land use planning, development decisions, and property taxation, while working alongside the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) and municipal staff to carry out council's direction.

Council members work collectively—no one councillor acts alone. This collaboration ensures decisions are made in the best interest of the whole community.

Skills and Responsibilities

There are no formal qualifications required to run, but strong communication, critical thinking, and problem-solving skills are valuable assets. The ability to understand budgets, listen to diverse perspectives, and manage time effectively will help councillors succeed. Training and support are provided for those new to municipal processes.

Challenges and Rewards

Serving on council is both demanding and rewarding. Councillors must balance diverse community interests, respond to public scrutiny, and dedicate time to learning local legislation. Yet the rewards include making real improvements, strengthening community relationships, and leaving a lasting legacy for future generations.

A Call to Community Leaders

Municipal governance is about building the kind of community residents want to live, work, and raise families in. From maintaining water and waste services to fostering economic growth, councillors have a direct hand in improving quality of life.

As the October election nears, Beaverlodge residents are encouraged to reflect on whether they are ready to take on this vital role. Nominations remain open until September 22, 2025 at noon.



As my first term on Beaverlodge Town Council comes to a close, I've been reflecting on the last four years and some of the lessons I've learned while serving our community.

When I first put my name forward, I had plenty of ideas for what I wanted to see in our town. A new arena, walking trails, a splash park, and more transparency for residents. But once elected, I quickly learned there is much more to local government than simply having good ideas. Every project involves processes, procedures, and budgets that must be followed carefully.

Working with our CAO, and participating in countless meetings, I came to understand just how much of our budget is already committed each year just to maintain and upgrade the infrastructure we have. That doesn't leave a lot of room for new projects unless we secure provincial or federal grants, which are highly competitive and never guaranteed. This is also why raising property taxes is often such a difficult conversation.

One thing I realized early on is that transparency does exist, our budget and financial information are all available online for the public to see. I know many residents want to understand where money goes, and I encourage everyone to take a look. It's eye opening to see the actual costs of even small upgrades.

Another important lesson for me was the value of communication. Talking with younger residents about how decisions are made, why things take time, and what constraints exist has often changed their perspective. That's why I encourage everyone to tune into our livestreamed council meetings or attend in person. It's the best way to see firsthand how decisions are made and to get to know your councillors. You can also join us at Coffee with Council as we welcome your questions and ideas.

I know there's sometimes a perception that council isn't doing enough or doesn't care. The truth is, every member works hard with the information and resources available, knowing that no decision will ever make everyone happy.

With elections around the corner, I hope residents will take time to attend a meeting or reach out to a councillor with their questions. And if you've ever thought about contributing your own ideas and energy, I strongly encourage you to consider running for council. It's a challenging but rewarding way to serve Beaverlodge, and our community is always better when more voices are at the table.
