Registered electors must be:

- Canadian Citizens
- 18 years of age or older
- Ordinarily Resident in Alberta



To vote, you must prove your identity and current **PHYSICAL** address. To do this, you may:

IF REGISTERED

 Provide one piece of Government-issued photo ID, including your full name, current address, and photo. CAN BE YOUR POST OFFICE BOX ONLY IF ALREADY REGISTERED TO VOTE.

IF NOT REGISTERED

 Provide two pieces of ID, both containing your full name, and with one showing your current PHYSICAL ADDRESS.

Annual Medical Student Tour Showcases the Peace Region

For well over a decade, the South Peace **Professional Attraction** and Retention Committee has proudly organized an annual bus tour for medical professional students across our region. Held on the first Saturday of September, the tour begins in Grande Prairie and travels through the County, visiting medical facilities in the Towns of Sexsmith, Wembley, Beaverlodge, and the Hamlet of Hythe.

Participants are introduced to our state-of-the-art medical clinics offering a wide range of services, continuing care facilities, and the dedicated professionals working in our aging hospital—whose resilience and

commitment truly embody the spirit of rural healthcare.

This year's tour was especially meaningful. Just four days earlier, the Northern Alberta Medical Program officially welcomed its inaugural cohort of 30 medical students to Northwestern Polytechnic in Grande Prairie, marking a new chapter in Alberta's medical education. Through a partnership between the University of Alberta and Northwestern Polytechnic, the Doctor of Medicine program is now being delivered at the Rural Medical Education **Program Training Centre** in Grande Prairie.





Sixteen of these students, along with a graduating nurse, joined us on the tour. It was a wonderful opportunity to showcase our region and inspire them to consider building their careers here after graduation. With Beaverlodge Hospital serving as a teaching hospital, many of these students will gain hands-on experience in our facility.

For more than 90 years, the Beaverlodge Elks have been a steady, roll-up-your-sleeves force for good in our community. Formed in July 1934 by neighbours who believed service could change lives, today's Elks continue that tradition with the same heart, humility, and hometown pride.

A Legacy Of Pitching In

From helping families through tough times to building the places where we gather, the Elks' history reads like a love letter to Beaverlodge. They've organized fundraisers for individuals in need; supported two curling rinks, a firehall, swimming pools, the arena, playgrounds, and even a BMX motocross course; and for years ran the May 24 Sports Day ball tournaments while helping coordinate the May 24 AG Fair and Parade. At the hospital, they furnished a consultation room and purchased fetal and cardiac monitors, and they've backed local youth through scholarships, Scouts, schools, figure skating, camps, and more.

They've volunteered at the South Peace Museum gate, supported Crime Stoppers, and even donated equipment to River Bend Golf Course.

That spirit is alive and well. Recently, the Elks have supported Parkinson's and Veterans associations, the Cemetery Association, Hospital Auxiliary, FCSS Beaverlodge, Beaverlodge Minor Soccer, BRHS scholarships, 4-H, the Food Bank, the United Church, and the Mural Foundation. They've built wheelchair ramps, quietly helped individuals in moments of need, and contributed a defibrillator for the Fire Department. You'll also spot them cooking and serving hot dogs and drinks at local events, and cosponsoring and coordinating the community fireworks during Christmas Craze.

The future is wide open—and the Elks want your ideas and energy. Soap box derbies?

Support for the spray park? New projects for kids, families, and seniors? "The future is limitless... it's up to you," their call reads. If you care about building a better Beaverlodge, there's a place for you at the table.

A typical volunteer attends a monthly meeting to help guide projects and funding, and there are always hands-on ways to help beyond the meeting room. 

Beginning October 10th through November 3rd the aquatics facilities will be closed for annual maintenance and deep cleaning.


This will include all 3 pools, as well as intermittent closures of our change rooms for those Fitness Centre users who access them.
